1	I see on product description you mentioned single use, disposable , then you also gave an option for re-usable woven. If we do both disposable and re-usable can we quote both , and if yes, how do we allocate quantities to match the total required? Or do we quote for that is readily available for as long as the total we have is less the total amount required?	Under Gown Isolation two options are provided. Both gown options are single use, the difference is the material. The quotes should clearly indicate the type of gown and against each option, define the quantities you are bidding for. Kindly take into consideration the quantity allocation across the four different sizes required Small, Medium, Large and Extra Large
2	The tender advert states we need to submit two sets with the original copy being send to Aquity Innovations 114 Sovereign Drive. Its not clear on the electronic copy whether we are sending it through mail to tenders@aquity.org?	The second electronic copy can be submitted and saved in a flash stick, clearly labelled and placed in an envelope and included in the submission.
3	May you please confirm how long will the tender valid for?	The tender is for a once off procurement of PPE. All bids to abide by the stipulated closing date.
4	We have seen that the date for the submission for samples was not stated on the tender it was only stated that “All samples must be submitted to the reception between 10 am and 3 pm”, may you kindly advise the date for samples submission.	The samples should be submitted no later than the closing date of the bid 4 Nov 2020 by 11 a.m.
5	May you please advise the UOM for below items: - Apron, Disposable- Pack\100 or Each? - Gloves, examination – non sterile- B\100 or Unit? - Gloves, examination Sterile- B\100 or Unit?	The Unit of Measure refers to the Pack Size ... If your box of aprons comes in 100’s your unit of measure will be 100 Aprons per Box.
6	Our company manufactures disinfectants, sanitisers and all cleaning materials and related equipment. Our company has certification of A Swift Laboratory ,MSDS and correct labelling and packaging according to standards required. Our disinfectants also have NRCS permits currently. We do not however, have a SAPHRA Certificate can we still tender for the sanitisers and submit the sample?	All Hand sanitisers should meet the WHO requirements listed in the TORs. The TORs specify that Hand sanitisers should have “at least 80% ethanol or 75% isopropyl alcohol (v/v)”. There should be proof that the hand sanitiser was manufactured at a facility that meets the Good Manufacturing Practice.
